TWO Entry Per Class

Premium checks will be mailed AFTER the Fair - First \$2 and second \$1

Des Moines County Fair is in no case responsible for any loss or damage that might occur

All entries must have been grown or made by someone who has taken an active part in preparing the entry

Entries cannot have been show at the Fair before either by a 4H/FFA Exhibitor or Adult

Baked items need to be displayed on paper plates and in a plastic bag with a recipe card

No Bake sale will be held

Canned entries should be displayed in standard clear pint and quart jars with lid and ring on the jar. If necessary, Canned entries maybe opened by the judges

Jelly and Jams should be displayed in standard glass jelly jar with a lid and ring – No Wax please

Vegetables need to be exhibited on 9-inch paper plate

Flowers may be replaced with fresh ones at any time after judging for the duration of the fair

Cut flowers will be displayed in containers furnished by the Fair
Arrangement will be allowed to remain in the presented container

Craft entries will be disqualified if soiled or stained

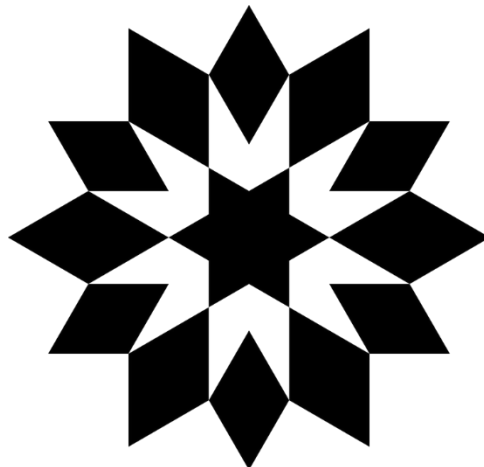

Agricultural & HORTICULTURE Crops Department
(Formally just Horticulture)
Best in Show Rosette Classes 203-238

Where applicable tops or stems should be cut leaving one inch on the vegetable. Items should be left as natural as possible with only light washing or brushing. No dirt clods should be left on the item. Items to be displayed on paper plates, unless otherwise noted; (#) means number of specimens.

- Class 203– Popcorn (3) any variety – entry must contain all the same variety
variety must be listed on the entry tag
- Class 204– Field Corn - Must be in a quart jar sealed with a lid and ring
sample from last year’s crop – variety must be listed on the entry tag
- Class 205– Small Grains – must be in a quart jar sealed with a lid and ring
variety must be listed on the entry tag
- Class 206 – Soybeans – Must be in a quart jar sealed with a lid and ring
sample from last year’s crop – variety must be listed on the entry tag
- Class 207 – Beans (5)– any variety – entry must contain all the same variety
- Class 208 - Beets, Table (4)
- Class 209 - Cabbage (1) any variety – entry must contain all the same variety
- Class 210 - Carrots, (5) – entry must all be the same length

Each member may exhibit one bucket of flowers, in a plain white 5-gallon bucket.

Be sure to provide adequate drainage for the plants in your bucket and consider adding pinecones or an upside-down pot inside the bucket to make the bucket lighter.

The bucket should include 3-5 varieties of plants, with attention to a colorful display.

Buckets must be planted by June 1st.

The bucket of flowers will be judged on the quality of the plants and the attractiveness of the display.

AFTER JUDGING, THE BUCKETS WILL BE DISPLAYED AROUND THE FAIR GROUNDS AND THE MEMBER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR WATERING IT DURING THE FAIR. THE DISPLAY SHOULD INCLUDE A LIST OF SPECIES AND VARIETY OF EACH PLANT IN THE BUCKET.

Des Moines County Master Gardeners will host an informational workshop in May for youth who are interested in entering this class. Attendees of this workshop will learn best practices for growing their bucket of flowers and will go home with supplies to start their project.
